Jersey Library offer a range of services from borrowing books, lunchtime talks, Eagle Lab facilities, workshops and exhibitions. There are Blue Badge parking spaces with a one-hour limit immediately outside with a lift to the first floor. Disabled toilet facilities are also available.





Accessible Walks

Jersey has a number of beautiful walks that are ideal for wheelchair users and other visitors with disabilities. Here are a selection of routes that are not only a great way of seeing the island but flat and surfaced with no obstructions.



Accessible Walks

St. Helier to St. Aubin

This popular walk is always full of life. Cyclist, runners and time passers flock to the paved seaside promenade which runs along the sea wall with beautiful views of Elizabeth Castle and St. Aubin's Bay. Finish at St. Aubin's pretty harbour with many delicious eating spots for a leisurely meal with sea views.

St. Catherine's Breakwater Walk

With its stunning views across to France, this is one of Jersey's most iconic areas. St. Catherine's Bay has beautiful views across to France on a clear day and is an excellent spot for anglers. There is ample parking, a café and public and disabled toilet facilities.





Accessible Walks

Introducing Gorey

Get to know the picturesque harbour, starting at the pier. Enjoy the coastal views, busy fishing village and historic castle, Mont Orgueil. Follow the paved promenade south along Jersey's east coast with sea views of the Royal Bay of Grouville until you reach 'Rhonas at the Beach' at Gorey slip for a bite to eat.

St. Peter's Valley Linear Walk

Take the newly constructed pedestrian and cycle path providing a safe route through the beautiful green valley of St. Peter. The route is smooth with a gentle incline for a peaceful leafy stroll, passing the Vic in The Valley pub and finishing just before the country parish of St. Mary.

The Railway Walk – St. Brelade

As its name implies, this walk follows the route of the old railway from St. Aubin to Corbière. The walk is about six kilometres long and slopes gently up to the iconic lighthouse. Although the Railway Walk slopes gently, we recommend that wheelchair users take this walk with a carer, friend or family member because it is made of hoggin, a compactable groundcover, and the surface can change/move after heavy rain.





Accessible Walks

Town Heritage Walk

Starting at First Tower, this walk follows the sea wall along the route of the old railway line towards St. Helier. The final stages of the walk include beautiful sea views and the iconic Jersey heritage site Elizabeth Castle, built on a rocky islet in St. Aubin's Bay. Take a trip out along the causeway to the castle at low tide, using a BeachAbility wheelchair available from Le Fregate Café at West Park or take the amphibious castle ferry.

Victorian Town Walk

From the Jersey Museum walk across the Weighbridge to Liberation Square, where the Liberation celebrations take place. Continue up Mulcaster Street and onto Bond Street to take a walk through St. Helier Town Church yard and then onto the Royal Square. Take a seat at one of the local pubs or restaurants lining the paved hub of St. Helier and soak up town atmosphere.
